Greetings in the name of the Resurrected Lord!

Throughout the Lenten season we have looked to the scriptures for guidance in finding true love and reconciliation with God. We learned that to live in true love required examination, looking within ourselves or “taking stock” of our lives as my grandmother would say. And through the Holy Week journey we were reminded that with God we can overcome our past, the obstacles in our present lives, and even death — not that our suffering will go away, but that walking in the light of God gives us the power to begin again. The stone barrier blocking the threshold of our lives has been rolled away, and we are called to come out of our fear and darkness, into a life of true love and the light of Christ.

Praise be to God!

Our church has passed over a threshold as well, as we voted at our All Church Conference on March 27 to become a Reconciling Congregation, one that welcomes all of God’s people in the spirit of that true love to which Christ calls us.

I was so proud to be a part of Faith Church on that day. We followed a model of Holy Conversation, where all were invited to be heard with respect and love, with no showing of bias from the congregation through clapping or expression. All of those who spoke based their words in their Christian faith and in scripture — there was no anger or bitterness. We spent time in silent prayer after each person finished speaking. In the end we held an anonymous written vote, with the overwhelming majority voting to join the Reconciling movement. Following the vote we had closing prayer and adjourned in silence.

This was an emotional event for many, if not most of us. But several of you approached me after the meeting with one question — how can we hold in love and care those of us who did not agree with the outcome? Our love for each other in the Faith Church community is greater than any issue that might divide us. Christ was truly among us on that day!

Special thanks to William Cox and Susan Mullin for leading us in this journey, to Karolyn Busacker for writing our excellent Reconciling Statement, and especially love and thanks to Michele Dexter for sharing her journey with us.

Again I say, Praise be to God!

Team Report

Finance Ministry Team Quarterly Report March 2011

The Operating budget fund balance at the end of the 1st quarter was \$11,500. Unfortunately, the momentum in giving that was experienced at the end of last year and the beginning of this quarter has been slipping. In March alone expenses exceeded receipts by almost \$6,000. For the first three months of this year receipts are about equal to expenses. Therefore, the Operating Fund balance has returned to the same level as at the end of 2010. The Ministry Teams are managing their expenses within their budgets and are dependent on the Faith family to continue their generous giving.

The Capital budget fund balance at the end of the 1st quarter was \$20,900. The monthly mortgage payment is \$9,180 so it would be highly beneficial to build the balance with at least another two months of mortgage payments. Please review your Capital Appeal pledge to ensure your payments are on schedule. All contributions are appreciated and, as always, sooner is better. This will ensure a cash flow that supports our bank obligation. The principal balance as of March 31 was \$1,196,321.

If you are using stocks for either the Operating or the Capital budget payments, please remember to go through your broker or Merrill Lynch to facilitate a tax-free transfer to our church. The church office also needs to know in advance of these transactions so they can help ensure the prompt sale of the stock and recording of your donation.

Going forward, let's regain our operating budget giving momentum! Your continued generosity is greatly appreciated. If you have any questions, please contact the church office or one of us.

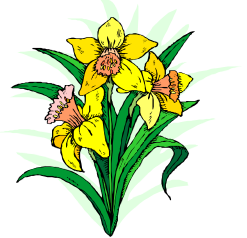
