### What are you seeking?



The Wicklow valley and Glendalough, near the east coast of Ireland, is known for its beautiful mountains, winding roads, lakes and waterfalls. Many well-known movies were filmed in the area – *Braveheart*, *King Arthur*, *Excaliber*, *Michael Collins*, *Into the West*, *Far and Away* and *P.S. I Love You* – to name a few. The land has an enchanted quality and has long attracted seekers.

Among the earliest seekers was St. Kevin. In Glendalough, just across the road from the retreat center where I stayed, are the ruins of a monastery founded by Kevin. Christianity came to Ireland in the mid-fifth century; Kevin lived in the 8<sup>th</sup> century. He traveled alone to the Wicklow valley searching for healing or answers or simply deep communion with Christ. He built a hermitage on a mountainside overlooking a lake, where he lived alone for many years. He found an ancient Bronze-age tomb in a cliff nearby, where he would go to fast and pray for days. He began to understand his innate connection to all of creation – the birds and the beasts and the land he lived on.

Many other travelers came to the area seeking healing or answers from God. Some of them stayed, and a monastic community was formed. The ruins of this community include 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> century churches, an 8<sup>th</sup> century Celtic cross, many ancient gravesites and the best-preserved round tower in Ireland. There are also wells said to have healing properties, and the people would splash their faces with the water from these wells in hope of being made well.

I wonder how many of those who came to the Wicklow valley found whatever it was they were seeking. I know I did. The interesting thing is – I didn't know exactly what I was looking for until I got there. On the advice of my spiritual director I did not leave for my retreat with an agenda, just a vague idea of where God was calling me to focus and an open heart and mind. I chose a book to bring along that turned out to be the perfect choice. And I followed the direction of the leaders at the retreat center. We had meditation for one hour in the morning and evening, and each day we would hike to a different sacred site for the Eucharist. The rest of the time was mine to write, reflect, hike and explore the countryside, and sometimes laugh with my fellow seekers.

The secret is timing, I think. It is during transitional times in our lives that we seek. (For me, my new ministry at Faith, death and illness in my family, and time of life.) This is true for the majority of people entering churches for the first time – they are experiencing a time of transition, be it a new job, a new community, death of a loved one, illness, marriage or divorce, a new baby or some other life change.

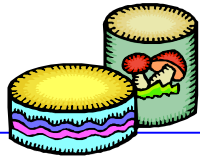
It's easy to be a seeker in a time of transition – change is a great motivator. Change is also growth, and it's more difficult for us to grow when we are comfortable. And we love comfort and the familiar – that's why we put great energy into resisting change!

God doesn't call us into long periods of comfort – not until perhaps the very end of our lives here on earth. God calls us to keep growing in wisdom, in understanding, and especially in love. Each of us is on our own path toward this shared goal. At different times we seek different things to move us forward in the journey – but we should always be seeking. I have learned that seeking does not mean looking ahead so much as it means living in the moment. It does not mean speaking so much as listening.

What are you looking for? Take some time in the moment and listen to God's voice within you.

# Team Report

## Finance Ministry Team – Year-to-Date June 2011

The Operating budget fund balance at the end of June was \$8,900. One year ago at this time, the balance was \$2,500. We continue to improve our financial position although in the month of June expenses exceeded receipts by \$3,500. We must continue our efforts at maintaining steady contributions over the difficult summer months.

The Capital Appeal fund balance at the end of June was \$27,555 and is sufficient to make three monthly mortgage payments of \$9,181. It would be desirable to have a balance of five to six months of mortgage payments in reserve to meet this commitment. The principal balance on the mortgage is \$1,185,000. As always, a periodic review of the status of your pledge toward this obligation is most appreciated.

If you are using stocks to support your church for either the Operating budget or the Capital budget, remember to go through your broker or Merrill-Lynch to assure a tax-free transfer. Also, please let the church office know if you are transferring stocks for this purpose, as this will ensure the prompt sale of the transferred stocks and the recording of your donation.

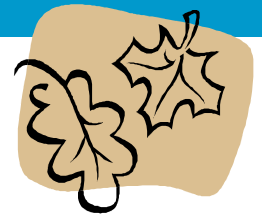

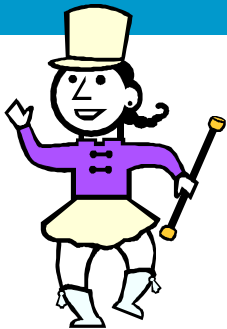
