# Ah, Summer in Minnesota!

Shades of green, fresh breezes (at least today, as I write this!), warm temperatures, freedom from the burden of heavy coats, scarves, gloves and all of the other necessities for survival in most of our Minnesota days.

In San Antonio people move very slowly in the summer. Temperatures reaching over 100 degrees will slow a person down. I think it is the relatively short duration of the summer season that slows us down in Minnesota. These days are precious and few, and for some folks the only time of the year when they can enjoy being out in nature. Many travel to cabins, others take a break from teaching our children and youth, and still others take vacations from their jobs while the kids are free, to enjoy time together as a family. Whatever your situation, a break from the routine of our ordinary days seems welcome.

Summer is also a time of life transition. Our youth are being confirmed, graduating from high school, going off to college for the first time. Even if this isn't a year of transition for your family, chances are you will attend one of the many graduation parties that are being held this month.

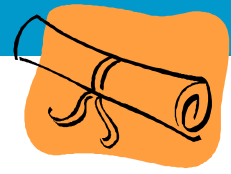
Other changes may be happening in your family that have nothing to do with the season of year, but are rather part of the seasons of life. Illness, death, loss of job – these things follow no calendar. There may not be official gatherings to mark them, but we reach out to each other in these times as well. Just as we celebrate together, we walk the difficult roads together.

Whatever this summer brings, I hope you find time in the longer, slower days to live the moment you are in. We are often rushing through our lives, juggling the many tasks we and the world create to distract us. Summer gives us time to take a break from *doing* and focus on *being*.

*In the long run the stories all overlap and mingle like searchlights in the dark. The stories Jesus tells are part of the story Jesus is, and the other way round. And the story Jesus is is part of the story you and I are because Jesus has become so much a part of the world's story that it is impossible to imagine how any of our stories would have turned out without him, even the stories of people who don't believe in him or even know who he is or care about knowing. And my story and your story are all part of each others too if only because we have sung together and prayed together and seen each other's faces so that we are at least a footnote at the bottom of each other's stories.*

*In other words all our stories are in the end one story, one vast story about being human, being together, being here. Does the story point beyond itself? Does it mean something? What is the truth of this interminable, sprawling story all of us are? Or is it as absurd to ask about the truth of it as it is to ask about the truth of the wind howling through a crack under the door?*

## Here is a short story you might enjoy:

While watching a little TV on Sunday, I watched a church in Atlanta honoring one of its senior pastors who had been retired many years. He was 92 at that time and I wondered why the church even bothered to ask the old gentleman to preach at that age. After a warm welcome, introduction of this speaker, and as the applause quieted down, he rose from his high back chair and walked slowly, with great effort and a sliding gait to the podium. Without a note or written paper of any kind he placed both hands on the pulpit to steady himself and then quietly and slowly he began to speak....

"When I was asked to come here today, your pastor asked me to tell you what was the greatest lesson ever learned in my 50-odd years of preaching. I thought about it for a few days and boiled it down to just one thing that made the most difference in my life and sustained me through all my trials. The one thing that I could always rely on when tears, heartbreak, pain, fear or sorrow paralyzed me. The only thing that would comfort was this verse. *'Jesus loves me this I know. For the Bible tells me so. Little ones to Him belong, we are weak but He is strong. Yes, Jesus loves me....The Bible tells me so.'*"
