Connect. It's one of our strengths at Faith United Methodist Church. We are a friendly, open and caring community. We value our relationships within the church. We value our relationship with God.

And yet life is challenging and complicated. We are easily distracted. Our schedules are difficult and overwhelming. It becomes harder to dedicate ourselves to the most important things in our lives. But if we are to live in the fullness of life to which God calls us, then true connection isn't something we do in name only, and it isn't something we do occasionally or without effort. True connection requires diligent action. It requires a consistent and *intentional* commitment to God and to the church. A commitment to ***be present*** within the community by attending worship and church events when possible. A commitment to ***grow in knowledge*** of the Christian faith by attending Sunday School, lectionary group, a UMW circle, or an evening class or Bible Study (at Faith or in the community). A commitment to ***deepen your relationship with God*** through prayer, meditation, or joining a covenant disciple group (you will hear more about these in the coming months.) A commitment to ***live your faith*** through service to church and community.

Recently our lay leader, Janet Johnson, shared her faith journey at Faith UMC in her sermon on Laity Sunday. As Janet spoke of beautiful sunsets at church camp, of the love and support she and Gary received while raising their children in Faith, of the comfort and care from the community when her father was recently injured... there was hardly a dry eye in the house. Many of us were connecting to our own rich and meaningful stories within our faith journeys. And the stories – the transformative moments, the love, the care – are not in our past only. They are woven into the possibilities unfolding in our lives. They are the stories of our future together!

You are a part of Faith Church because you wish to make God a priority in your life, and the church is where you go to intentionally encounter God. Your church leaders and I want to help, by making worship and Christian education as accessible as possible to the majority of our members, and by bringing our members together in one place at one time for worship.

It is in this spirit that we are making a change here at Faith Church. Beginning the first Sunday of Advent (November 27) we will begin a new Sunday morning schedule:

9:00-10:00 am Christian Education
10:00-10:30 am Fellowship Time
10:30-11:30 am Worship

We will also be participating in an Advent study together: *The Journey* by Adam Hamilton. From November 27 through December 18 each Sunday School class – children, youth and adults – will follow this study. (See more info on page 3.)

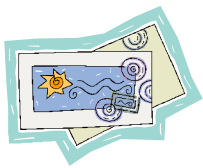

Team Reports

FINANCE MINISTRY TEAM – YEAR-TO-DATE SEPTEMBER REPORT, 2011

The **Operating** budget fund balance at the end of September was \$870. One year ago at this time the balance was \$419. At the end of February this year the balance was nearly \$19,000 but over recent months our expenses have significantly exceeded receipts, while our expenses are more than \$8,000 below budget. Please review your pledge status to ensure that your giving is up-to-date, so that we might return to a balance between planned receipts and expenses.

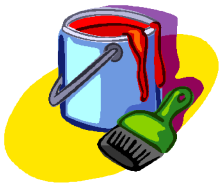
The **Capital Appeal** fund balance at the end of September was \$21,690 and is sufficient to make a little more than two monthly mortgage payments of \$9,181. It would be desirable to have a balance of 5 to 6 months of mortgage payments as a reserve to meet this commitment. The principal balance on the mortgage is \$1,175,000. As always, a periodic review of the status of your pledge toward this obligation is most appreciated.

If you are using stocks to make payments for either the Operating budget or the Capital budget, remember to go through your broker or Merrill-Lynch to assure a tax-free transfer to support your church. Please let the church office know if you are transferring stocks to give to the church. This will ensure the prompt sale of the transferred stocks and the recording of your donation.

ASP update from Lincoln County, West Virginia



10 youth and 6 adult leaders from FUMC arrived home safely from working at the Appalachia Service Project in Harts, West Virginia. The group formed two teams of eight people, and worked at different job sites keeping the people of Appalachia warmer, safer, and dryer.

One team removed decking and repaired infrastructure of a mobile home roof by rebuilding the rafter tails and shoring up the 2 x 4 's with sister studs. They also installed vinyl soffits and installed a new metal roof! They were aided by an enthusiastic 13 year-old family member at the job site, who worked with the team for the entire day!! This was a wonderful family to work with, and the team had some interesting experiences getting to the job site (like fording a creek).

The other team worked on finishing underpinning the home and insulating underneath a portion. They also started on the fascia and the soffits. The team worked hard and enjoyed lemonade made by our family. We also enjoyed the company of a few stray dogs that showed up on our site and waited for us to arrive every morning. They formed a great connection with their family as well as the dogs!

Introducing...



Did You Know?

The Centers for Disease Control reports that each year, 350–500 million people contract malaria, and over a million die from the disease. The World Health Organization estimates that between 708,000 and 1,003,000 people died from malaria in 2008. Ninety percent of these deaths occurred in sub-Saharan Africa; and sadly, most of them were children under five years of age. Every thirty seconds, a child in Africa dies from malaria.

Worldwide, malaria is the fifth leading cause of death, after respiratory infections, HIV/AIDS, diarrheal diseases, and tuberculosis; in Africa, death from malaria is second only to HIV/AIDS. Half of the world's population—3.3 billion people—live in areas at risk of malaria transmission.

In addition, The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) says malaria is both a cause and a result of poverty. In Africa, the disease causes a net loss of \$12 billion every year because of the loss of productivity due to illness and death. Malaria accounts for 40 percent of the public health expenditure, 50 percent of all outpatient visits, and 30–50 percent of hospital admissions.

These sobering statistics call Christians in the United States and around the world to do something to end the suffering.

Connecting Faith and Life

A Spring 2011 *New York Times* online slideshow featured photographs provided by the Malaria Consortium. One photo demonstrates hope. It features a mother, Pheap Sung of Cambodia, carrying her sick child, Kam Sot Sung. In the caption, she says, “He was sick for three days, had a very high fever. I would have sought help at a private clinic, but I did not have the money. The free clinic is a long way, but I decided I had to take him. I thought he might have malaria. He looks so much better. I am thankful for the doctors here.”

A photo of Allen Namaweje of Uganda shows him under a mosquito net. He says, “I get bitten a bunch of times at night. I get sick five times a year, I think. When I get sick, I stay in bed. I am not lying in my bed; this is not my mosquito net. I do not use a mosquito net. We only have one and there's no place for me.”

Yet another photo underscores a personal tragedy as Saroeung Vuth of Cambodia tells of his efforts to save his sick brother. “It was October. The roads were impassable. We knew my brother had malaria. But it just kept raining. No way to use a taxi or bike, the roads were impassable. We took turns carrying him. Sometimes we sank to our waists in the mud; it took two days. But when we arrived at the main road he had died. He was a gentle man, a lot of fun. Whenever there was a party he was always invited.”

Hope and tragedy, side by side. All it takes is prevention and treatment, which includes things we take for granted: access to clinics and medicines. And something as simple as a mosquito net can make a world of difference.

In his book *Change the World*, Rev. Mike Slaughter, lead pastor at Ginghamburg Church in Ohio, calls for congregations to take the church into the world instead of coaxing the world into the church. This is one opportunity for us to do just that.

A Church-Wide Campaign

In 2008, the General Conference of The United Methodist Church voted to raise \$75 million dollars in a partnership to save lives from malaria-related deaths in Africa. ***Imagine No Malaria*** is the result. Each annual conference has been assessed a goal and our goal is 180,000 lives at \$1.8 million over the next three years. A generous donor kicked off the campaign with a \$600,000 gift. The Campaign has four emphases:

- Prevention**—bed nets, pesticides and drainage of standing water
- Treatment**—medical supplies, medication and rapid diagnoses
- Communication**—hand-cranked and solar-powered radios; broadcasts of prevention information
- Education**—volunteer training

We would like each of our members of Faith UMC to contribute to this campaign as you are able. Which giving level is appropriate for you?

- \$1000 A gift of \$1000, or a pledge of \$28 per month (or \$334 per year) over 3 years will save 1000 lives!
- \$100 A gift of \$100 will save 10 lives!
- \$10 A gift of \$10 will save a life!

This is your chance to contribute toward the solution for one of our greatest global challenges – one that has a great possibility for success. Malaria is preventable and treatable; we can eliminate this disease!
