From the Pen of Pastor Leigh

As I write, today is the Autumnal Equinox, the first day of autumn. The word *equinox* is derived from Latin *æquinociti*, which in turn came from *æquus* (equal) and *nox* (night). *Equinox* refers to the two times each year (in fall and in spring) when the nighttime is equal to the daytime – each 12 hours in duration.

The Church replaced earlier Pagan solstices and equinox celebrations during Medieval times with Christian observances. The Autumnal Equinox is celebrated as Michaelmas, the feast of St. Michael the Archangel (and in the Episcopal Church all angels.) The feast traditionally included a well-fattened goose to symbolically protect from famine in the coming winter. By Michaelmas the harvest was complete and the new cycle of farming began. It was also a time to settle debts, pay the rent and prepare financially for the winter months.

The autumn season is associated with the harvest, thanksgiving, abundance and the transition from warm to cold weather. It is an ending – cabins are closed, roses are buried and leaves fall from the trees. But it is also a beginning – for the school year and the church year.

Because of this sense of new beginning, the crisp air and the colors, fall has always been my favorite season. And it is much too short in Minnesota! But when I stop and consider, the cycle of the year is filled with new beginnings – Christmas and the birth of Christ, New Year's Day, spring with its reawakening of nature, Easter and the Resurrection. We have many opportunities during the year to celebrate rebirth and possibilities.

And isn't that fitting? Our God is a God of abundance. We have only to look in our Bible to find stories of God's rich provision. For 40 years in the wilderness, God fed the people with manna daily. Our God is also a God of mercy. Forgiveness is given to all who seek it and we are able to begin our lives anew. While life may bring challenges, endings and grief at times, God's promises and hope are unending. We have only to trust. With prayer and discernment we make choices that move us closer to God's kingdom on earth. And when our will is aligned with God's ultimate purpose, we experience a peace and joy that carries us through all seasons.

But always new pathways are opened to us and we begin again. May our journey together this fall be exciting and uplifting, and may we give glory to God in all we do!

Prayer Shawl Ministry

The Care Committee of our church would like enhance the **Prayer Shawl Ministry**. The purpose of this ministry is to give a shawl to every member of our church, or person in our community, who could be nurtured and blessed by a shawl during their time of need. There are also **prayer baby blankets** for babies who need our prayers and comfort. Shawls/blankets will be given away by Pastor Leigh, the Stephen's Ministers, or any member who visits a person in need.

To increase this ministry, volunteers who can knit or crochet are needed to make very simple shawls. Pamphlets are in the Commons with instructions, you can go online and Google "prayer shawl ministry instructions," or you can create your own version of the shawl/blanket. A full shawl takes four skeins of yarn and size 11 or 13 needles. We recommend HOMESPUN yarn by Lion Brand. Donations to purchase the yarn will also be accepted.

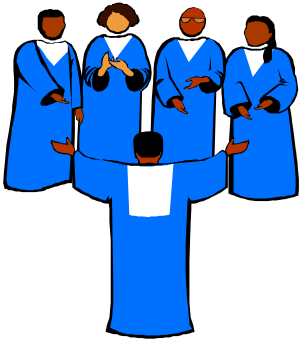

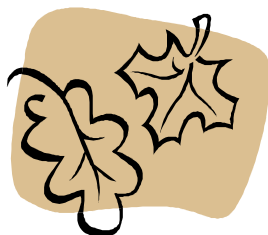

New Bike Ministry is Planned by Downtown Congregations to End Homelessness

One of the largest barriers for people to acquire housing or to find a job is transportation. Sitting in with Dignity Center clients, one hears story after story of people who cannot get a job or maintain their job and therefore become homeless because they do not have access to affordable and efficient transportation.

For many people who are homeless, buying a car is not a viable option. The cost of the bus quickly adds up as it is \$2.25 per ride during rush hour. Getting a bike will enable participants in the downtown congregations outreach programs to be able to have a reliable source of transportation so they don't have to rely on bus transportation exclusively.

The Downtown Congregations to End Homelessness Outreach program is planning to launch a bike ministry. In order to get ready for this new ministry, DCEH is planning a bike and furniture drive on Saturday September 26, 9:00-12:00 am in the HAUMC parking lot.
