Finance Ministry Team First Quarterly Report 2010

The Operating budget fund balance at the end of the 1st quarter was \$9,000. The momentum in giving that was experienced at the end of 2009 and the beginning of this quarter has slipped a bit over the month of March with expenses exceeding receipts by approximately \$3,000; even though our ministry teams did not overrun their planned expenditures. The Faith Family did, however, generously respond during the quarter to local and world outreach needs with thousands of dollars in extra giving; not to mention over a ton of food for FoodShare month in March. Outstanding!

The Capital budget fund balance at the end of the 1st quarter was \$38,370. This means that the needed income to support the mortgage payments is about on track assuming that the outstanding pledges are received. It would be beneficial to have some unplanned income arrive that we could use to pay down the principal and avoid some interest. The principal balance as of March 31 was \$1,234,380.

If you are using stocks to make payments for either the Operating budget or the Capital budget, remember to go through your broker or Merrill-Lynch to assure a tax-free transfer to support your church. Please let the church office know if you are transferring stocks to give to the church. This will ensure the prompt sale of the transferred stocks and the recording of your donation.

Going forward, let's regain our operating budget giving momentum! Your continued generosity is greatly appreciated. If you have any questions, please contact the church office or one of us.

Love Offering

Each year in May, a Love Offering is collected and brought to the Minnesota Annual Conference. The offering benefits international, national, and local mission projects. The theme for Annual Conference this year is "Rethink Worship." The offering will provide equipment and furniture for the new Aspiration United Methodist Church in St. Petersburg, Russia, and will supplement the salaries of pastors in the Oklahoma Indian Missionary Conference and provide training for Native American leaders and disciples. Thirty percent of the Love Offering funds will go to three recent church starts in Minnesota—New Day UMC in Big Lake, Spirit River Community UMC in Isanti, and Good Samaritan UMC in St. Peter. Ten percent of the offering will be used for scholarships for first-time Volunteers in Mission from Minnesota. The Love Offering will be collected during worship on May 23rd.

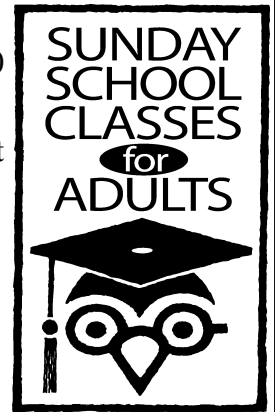

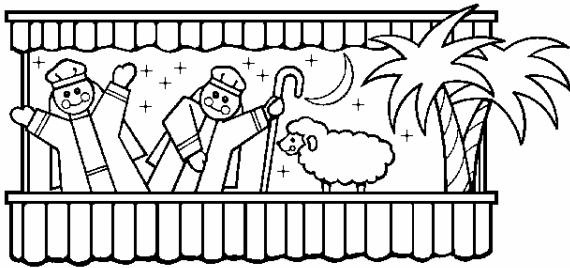

On Sunday, March 21, Faith's Outreach Committee hosted Hands-On Sunday attended by more than 100 people. We were told the story of "Stone Soup" by the high school Sunday school students during our services that morning. At noon we were treated to a delicious luncheon of stone soup, bread and dessert. Following lunch we gathered in our Food Fun Teams and constructed our designs from the food donations we brought in for the Ralph Reeder Food Shelf. We collected 1,964 pounds of food. It was an amazing sight. As the food was being sorted and boxed up for pick-up the next day the Health Kits for Haiti were being assembled. We donated over 500 health kits from Faith Church alone, exceeding our goal. We also collected \$966.87 to be sent to NEED in Northeast Minneapolis. Outreach wants to thank everyone who was involved. 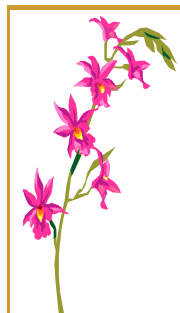
Metro West Builders Spring Call to Help Homeless Keep Their Beds

In 2009, nearly 600 homeless men slept overnight in the Simpson Housing Services shelter at Simpson UMC in Minneapolis. Soon Simpson Church and Simpson Housing Services (SHS) will increase the shelter space in the church to accommodate a nearby SHS shelter for homeless women, which is closing due to city zoning issues. For want of pavement on a small parking lot, people such as these could soon be sleeping on the street.

For the necessary expansion, the City of Minneapolis requires a Conditional Use Permit (CUP), which will allow the shelter to house up to 70 guests. Unfortunately, the small gravel parking area behind the church does not comply with city zoning regulations, and the city has ordered the church to pave it. Failure to do so could put the shelter CUP in jeopardy, which could mean closing the shelter.
