From the Pen of Pastor Leigh

In the May 16 worship services, six young men shared their faith statements and committed themselves to the Christian faith and to the United Methodist Church. Four we welcomed as members of Faith UMC, and two we blessed and sent home as members of their church, Trinity/Grace UMC. You can read more about these young men on page six of this newsletter. As their confirmation experience ends their journey of faith begins anew, and we are blessed to share this journey with them. Nothing is as rewarding and as uplifting for pastors or members than welcoming young people into the church, either through baptism or confirmation. And if these youth are a sign of our future, then our future holds great promise!

The gospel that was chosen for the confirmation service (the favorite scripture of one of our confirmands) is the same verse that was chosen by our children and their Sunday School teachers for Children's Sunday on May 6. It is John 13:34-35: *"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."*

This great commandment is the heart of our faith as Christians. It is this love for each other that binds us as the Body of Christ and as Faith Church. It is this love that makes us happy, joyous and free as human beings.

A friend of mine is also a United Methodist pastor in Minnesota. One day she was at the auto dealership getting her car fixed and she met a woman in the waiting room. When they made small talk and the woman found out that my friend is a pastor, she opened up to her – as people often do when they find out you're a pastor. The woman shared an amazing experience with my friend. She had suffered a medical trauma, died, and was brought back to life. She could remember clearly meeting Jesus in that time when she was lifeless. She said that Jesus asked her 3 questions:

1. What did you do with the resources I gave you?
2. Did you do what I asked you to do?
3. How much did you love?

If we keep these questions in our minds and hearts, and if we can answer them well, we will live in peace and joy and bring honor to God.

Our Vision

She served as a volunteer with Heifer Project at their ranch in Perryville, AR, and then with the Mennonite Central Committee on an agroforestry project in Haiti. A member of Faith UMC since 2005, she has been active in our church in many roles, including missions, teaching Sunday School and confirmation, preaching, leading worship, music ministry and serving on the staff-parish relations committee and as lay delegate to annual conference.

Sunday Morning Worship Schedule

Last year members of Faith Church agreed that the Sunday morning worship schedule would be re-evaluated at the end of the program year in June 2010. At present time the two services are attended fairly equally, and there is plenty of room for more in each service. In anticipation of the schedule review I did a survey in Sunday morning worship that I also made available to other groups in the church. The survey results showed that 75% of the respondents prefer the education hour between the two services. This does not seem to vary among those who have children in Sunday School. A slight majority (54%) would prefer that the traditional service be earlier and the celebration service second. The majority (76%) of those who attend 9 am worship attend because of the service time rather than the worship style. At the 11 am service 54% attend because they prefer the traditional service, while 46% actually prefer the 11 am service time. Also noteworthy are many comments from folks missing fellowship time on Sunday mornings.

With this in mind, and after consulting with church leadership, I would like to propose the following two schedule options. The third option is of course, to keep our present schedule.

Each of the two new schedule proposals solve two challenges. It brings fellowship time back into Sunday morning, which has been sorely missed. And it allows us to design a Celebration worship service that will truly be relational and appeal to younger people.

Please plan to attend the church conference on June 27 at 10:45 AM to vote on the Sunday morning worship schedule. If you cannot be there and wish to share your thoughts, please contact me.

Remember also that on May 30 we begin our summer schedule, with one Sunday worship service at 9:30 AM.

One thing is for certain – a little change we can easily manage. We’ve proven it this year!

Four Upcoming Mission Opportunities to Guatemala

Women to Women is scheduled for September 30-October 10, 2010. This program will bring together women from the U.S. and Guatemala in the village where the Guatemalan women live. Each U.S. woman will be paired with a Guatemalan hostess where she will gain firsthand experience of a woman's daily life in rural Guatemala. The objectives are to build relationships between women, foster cultural exchange and improved understanding of shared and distinct issues for women in Guatemala, and to move beyond the role of observer to that of participant to gain first-hand experience of the lives of rural indigenous Mayan women.

Three other scheduled mission opportunities in Guatemala include: Sept. 30-Oct. 10, 2010; January 1-10, 2011; March 11-22, 2011. The projects will include construction, medical/public health, and community development.
